


Prithvi Manthan: A compelling piece on global warming's dangers, endorsed by UNEP and awarded globally for its environmental message.

Nua Thikana Ku: Captures the journey of women finding her voice and purpose in a changing world.

Cycle Song: Bicycle represents the bittersweet nostalgia of distant memories. It evokes the familiarity of acquaintances and paths. The Bicycle's wheels also represent a change of season and moving on with life. In this case, the Bicycle plays Cupid for a warm love story.

Susmita's musical albums have rekindled an interest in literary classics and poetry:

- Maya Darpan: Based on poems by Dr. Mayadhar Mansingh, celebrating romantic poetry.
- Hati Saja Kara & Nua Luha Puruna Luha: Albums inspired by Devdas Chhotray's melancholic yet touching poetry.
- Rubai: Musical adaptation of Omar Khayyam's Rubaiyat, translated into Odia by Devdas Chhotray.
- Seasons: A unique album exploring moods in the six seasons, based on Kulamani Biswal's contemporary poetry.
- Deha Videha: Hara Prasad Das's Deha Videha is a musical tribute to the Tantric Buddhist tradition of Odisha (7th–12th century). It celebrates shunyata (emptiness), a core concept of Vajrayana Buddhism, capturing its spiritual essence for the first time through music.
- Yogini: Yogini draws inspiration from Charyapada and Vajrayana Buddhism's revolutionary inclusion of marginalized women. Featuring 28 songs, the film portrays women's struggles, desires, and their fight for freedom and equality, resonating with modern gender issues.




